

HOW TO TAKE PART:



YOU WILL NEED:

- A smartphone connected to 4G
- Headphones (optional but recommended for the best experience)

WHAT TO DO:

- Open the camera on your smartphone
- Point the camera at the QR code symbol
- A web link should appear - click this to go to the audio

If you are doing the trail outside, don't get run over! Be aware of uneven road surfaces and always stop to finish one audio episode before moving on to your next destination.

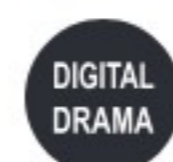

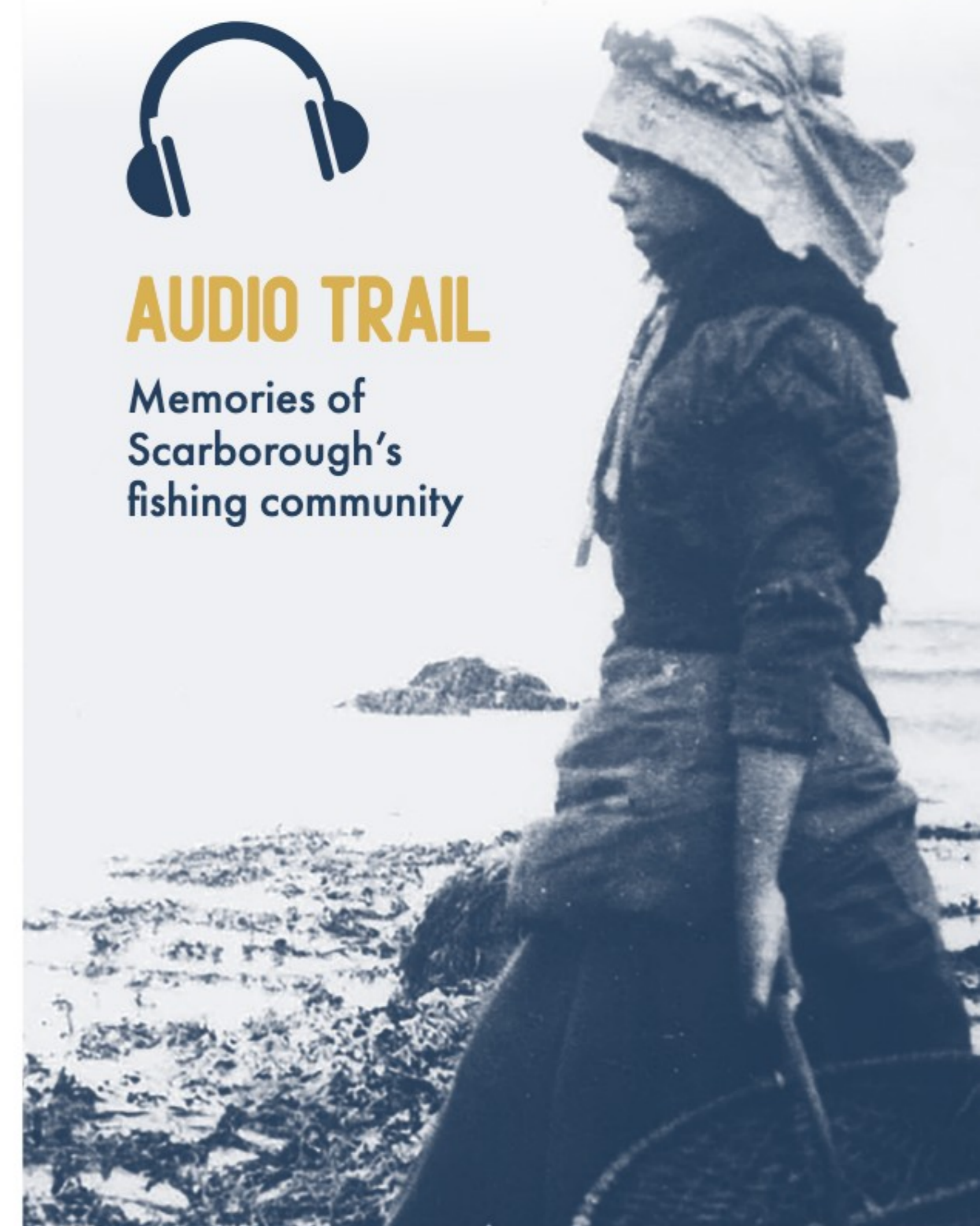
WHAT THE SEA SAW



AUDIO TRAIL

Memories of Scarborough's fishing community

WHAT THE SEA SAW dramatises the oral history memories of Scarborough's fishing community from the 1890s to the present day. Follow the map and use the QR codes to listen to the audio trail around Scarborough's iconic Bottom End to evoke the town's historic relationship with the sea.



ORDER OF AUDIO TRAIL STOPS

1. THE BUTTER CROSS, WEST SANDGATE (AKA PUMP HILL)

Steps on the right of the Butter Cross Stone

2. CUSTOM HOUSE STEPS/THE BOLTS

Take passageway next to Winking Willy's to steps

3. ST THOMAS'S CHURCH/SEA CADETS

Curved steps of former fishermen's church

4. BURR BANK

Memorial benches at top of Long Greece Steps

5. CASTLE GARDENS

Olive Quick's bench

6. LIGHTHOUSE PIER/INTERPRETATION BOARD

Painting of The Harbour by F.W. Booty, halfway along pier

7. LIGHTHOUSE PIER

Black & white building before Sidney Smith Bridge

8. LIGHTHOUSE

End of the pier, next to the Diving Belle Statue
